Write a description of events leading to Boudica's death.	<p>Award one mark for each point, up to max 4.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Her husband died. • She and her daughters were brutalised by Romans. • She led a rebellion. • She destroyed London/Colchester etc. • She fought a great battle against Suetonius. • She killed herself upon losing the battle. <p>Award marks for any other valid points.</p>	4
4		Which of these groups should we blame most for our lack of knowledge about the Celts; the Romans or the Druids? Explain your answer. You must talk about both groups in your answer. Give a justified conclusion at the end.	For this question, use the following best fit from the table below.	

Level 1	Describes some reasons for Romans OR Druids. Low quality of English – SpaG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar)	1-3
Level 2	Explains some reasons for Romans OR Druids. OR Describes some reasons from both sides of the argument. Comes to a basic conclusion as to who was most responsible. Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.	4-7
Level 3	Complex explanations of arguments BOTH for Romans and Druids. Uses a range of factors (at least three.) Comes to a clear, reasoned conclusion. Excellent SPaG with very few errors.	8-10
