A second mark can be awarded for detailed explanation.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• It is a system of peaceful protest.</li> <li>• It involves resisting laws without violence</li> <li>• It is helped by the media publicising the protests</li> <li>• Police brutality is expected but not resisted</li> <li>• Sympathy lies with the protesters rather than the authorities.</li> </ul> <p>Award marks for any other valid ideas.</p>	4
4		<p>'The British should not have left India in 1947.' Do you agree?</p> <p>Explain your answer. Aim to talk about both reasons for and against the statement, with examples of events from British-Indian history. Come to a justified conclusion at the end.</p>	For this question, use the following best fit from the table below.	

Level 1	Describes some reasons for <b>OR</b> against the statement.  Low quality of English – SpaG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar)	1-3
Level 2	Explains some reasons for <b>OR</b> against the statement.  <b>OR</b>  Describes some reasons from both sides of the statement.  May propose an alternative date to independence.  Comes to a basic conclusion as to whether the statement is true or not but this may not be explained.  Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.	4-7
Level 3	Complex explanations of arguments <b>BOTH</b> for and against the statement.  Uses a range of factors (at least three.)  Comes to a clear, reasoned conclusion.  Excellent SPaG with very few errors.	8-10
