Level 1	Describes only their chosen civilisation with no reference to others.  Low quality of English – SpaG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar)	1-3
Level 2	Basic comparison with two other civilisations.  <b>OR</b>  Detailed comparison with one other civilisation.  Comes to a basic conclusion but this may not be explained.  Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.	4-7
Level 3	Complex comparison with at least two other civilisations.  Comes to a clear, reasoned conclusion.  Excellent SPaG with very few errors.	8-10
