	b.	In what year did Kristallnacht happen?	1938	1
	c.	Give two things that happened to Jewish people on Kristallnacht.	Two points from: Jews killed/beaten up. Homes looted, windows smashed, synagogues burnt. Possessions stolen.	2
2.	a.	What is a ghetto?	A part of a city walled off as a forced home for Jews (or something similar).	1
	b.	Explain why Hitler created the ghettos.	There should be mention to at least four of these points, or two of them that have been explained in some detail. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He wanted to separate Jews from non-Jews. • He wanted to take the Jew's possessions/businesses. • He wanted them to die. • He wanted to make it easier to move them to concentration camps. <p>A second mark may be awarded for a point if it has added detailed explanation.</p>	4
3.	a.	What is this man's name?	Heinrich Himmler	1
	b.	Explain what the job of the Einsatzgruppen was.	There should be mention to at least four of these points, or two of them that have been explained in some detail. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • They were tasked with killing Jews and other 'undesirables. • They were active in Eastern Europe, following up the Nazi invasion. • They killed whole communities of Jews. • They used guns, dogs and mobile gas chambers. <p>A second mark may be awarded for a point if it has added detailed explanation.</p>	4

4	<p>'We must remember the holocaust.' Do you agree?</p> <p>Explain your answer. Aim to talk about both reasons for and against the statement. Be sure to come to a definite conclusion one way or the other.</p>	<p>For this question, use the following best fit from the table below.</p>

Level 1	<p>Describes some reasons for OR against the statement.</p> <p>Low quality of English – SpaG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar)</p>	1-3
Level 2	<p>Explains some reasons for OR against the statement.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Describes some reasons from both sides of the statement.</p> <p>Comes to a basic conclusion as to whether the statement is true or not but this may not be explained.</p> <p>Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.</p>	4-7
Level 3	<p>Complex explanations of arguments BOTH for and against the statement.</p> <p>Uses a range of factors other than the treaty (at least two others.)</p> <p>Comes to a clear, reasoned conclusion.</p> <p>Excellent SPaG with very few errors.</p>	8-10
