PUSH <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The countryside is boring/has a lack of jobs/dangerous/has a lack of education or healthcare/people don't want to be farmers.</li> </ul> PULL <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>The city is exciting/has jobs/access to healthcare and education/opportunity to become rich/more of a buzz/family may be there.</li> </ul> Accept any other relevant factors.	4
3.	a.	How many people need to live in a city to make it a megacity? 10,000,000	1
	b.	Explain why a slum is not a pleasant place to live. Award one mark for a point and a second if it is explained in some detail. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Life is uncertain. Housing is illegal and can be removed by the government at any time.</li> <li>It's unhealthy. Disease can spread quickly.</li> <li>Poverty. Poverty leads to poor diet and possibly crime.</li> </ul>	4

			<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Lack of resources. There is little or no access to clean water/sanitation/electricity etc.</li> <li>• Housing is very basic. Hard to keep warm or stable.</li> <li>• Lots of people. This means lack of available jobs.</li> <li>• Lack of access to education/healthcare etc.</li> </ul>

Level 1	<p>Describes some reasons for <b>OR</b> against the statement.</p> <p>Low quality of English – SpaG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar)</p>	1-3
Level 2	<p>Explains some reasons for <b>OR</b> against the statement.</p> <p><b>OR</b></p> <p>Describes some reasons from both sides of the statement.</p> <p>Comes to a basic conclusion as to whether the statement is true or not but this may not be explained.</p> <p>Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.</p> <p><i>There must be references to at least one specific city to reach Level 2.</i></p>	4-7
Level 3	<p>Complex explanations of arguments <b>BOTH</b> for and against the statement.</p> <p>Comes to a clear, reasoned conclusion.</p> <p>Excellent SPaG with very few errors.</p> <p><i>There must be references to more than one specific city to reach Level 3.</i></p>	8-10
