Accept any other valid points. 4
3.	a.	What biological theory did Darwin come up with?	Evolution 1
	b.	Explain this theory. Aim to use four steps.	Award one mark for each point. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Life started off as microorganisms. • Evolution happened due to survival of the fittest. • Natural selection leads to breeding that highlights genetic traits. • Ancestors of monkeys evolved into humans (not monkeys themselves). Award marks for an example of evolution or a chain of creatures. 4

Level 1	Describes some reasons for OR against the statement. Low quality of English – SpaG (Spelling, punctuation and grammar)	1-3
Level 2	Explains some reasons for OR against the statement. OR Describes some reasons from both sides of the statement. Comes to a basic conclusion as to whether the statement is true or not but this may not be explained. Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.	4-7
Level 3	Complex explanations of arguments BOTH for and against the statement. Uses a range of factors other than the treaty (at least two others.) Comes to a clear, reasoned conclusion. Excellent SPaG with very few errors.	8-10
