Give four reasons why Nero is known as an evil emperor.	<p>Award one mark for a point.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Killed his mum. • Murdered a lot of people. • Persecuted Christians. • Killed his wife. • Made a slave pretend to be his wife. • Was an actor (shameful at the time). • Killed St. Peter. • Cheated at the Olympics. • Credit one mark for stating that he may not have been as evil as they say. <p>Award marks for any other relevant points.</p>	4

Level 2	<p>Explains some reasons for OR against the statement.</p> <p>OR</p> <p>Describes some reasons from both sides of the statement.</p> <p>Comes to a basic conclusion as to whether the statement is true or not but this may not be explained.</p> <p>Good SPaG – some mistakes but not many.</p>	4-7
Level 3	<p>Complex explanations of arguments BOTH for and against the statement.</p> <p>Comes to a clear, reasoned conclusion.</p> <p>Excellent SPaG with very few errors.</p>	8-10
